QUALIFICATION DESCRIPTION:

This qualification reflects the role of support workers who complete specialized tasks and functions in aged services; either in residential, home or community-based environments. Workers will take responsibility for their own outputs within defined organization guidelines and maintain quality service delivery through the development, facilitation and review of individualized service planning and delivery.

Workers may be required to demonstrate leadership and have limited responsibility for the organization and the quantity and quality of outputs of others within limited parameters. No licensing, legislative, regulatory or certification requirements apply to this qualification at the time of publication.

COURSE DURATION:

Total duration 52 weeks including 10 weeks of holidays break. 10-week holiday/term break is scattered as per the timetable which will be provided to student before commencement or discusses during the enrolment. Students will participate in a total of 1400 hours of volume of learning.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

AGE REQUIREMENTS:

All international students must be 18 years of age to apply.

LLN:

Applicants must undertake a language, literacy, and numeracy assessment during their induction session prior to beginning the qualification. Results will be assessed on an individual level by the assessor. Depending upon the level of support required for the language, literacy, or numeracy an alternative training and assessment methods may be used or the learners will be recommended through individual support to fulfill the LLN gaps during the student journey.

OVERSEAS STUDENT HEALTH COVER (OSHC)

All international students must have Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) for the entire duration of their stay in Australia.

COMPUTER LITERACY REQUIREMENTS:

All students enrolling into Global Healthcare Management College programs must have basic computer skills. Student will be asked questions related to computer and internet skills in the Pre-enrolment Interview by GHMC staff.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS:

Participants must be able to undertake the physical tasks required in this role including manual handling using equipment in an aged care or disability care setting.

WORK PLACEMENT:

Students are required to undertake a Practical placement of 140 hours. This placement gives the student the opportunity to apply their knowledge acquired in the classroom into work-based practices. A Police Clearance Certificate is mandatory prior to your work placement; you must undertake a Federal Police Check (AFP). This can be done through a website. Students need to bear any expense related to police check or any other checks required to get placements. GHMC can assist finding suitable placements upon request.

ENGLISH REQUIREMENTS:

We accept the admission to the students if they qualify in ANYONE (1) of the following:

International students applying for this course either off-shore or on-shore will require:

- Either a minimum IELTS test score of 6.0 (with no component lower than 5) or equivalent for direct entry into a VET course; Results older than two years are not acceptable.

OR

- To provide evidence that they have studied in English for at least 5 years in Australia, Canada, New Zealand, Republic of Ireland, South Africa, United Kingdom, or United States.

OR

- Evidence that within two years of their application date, they have successfully completed Certificate III or higher-level qualification from the Australian Qualifications Framework.

DELIVERY MODE:

Delivery is face to face classroom based under supervision from a qualified trainer and assessor. Where this delivery includes provided student notes, learning activities and guided learning. Experience in simulated workplace environments allowing for training, practice, and assessment to occur in an appropriate environment (subject to units). During the practical sessions, enough time is allocated to students to perform the required tasks, practice their skills, reinforce their knowledge, and prepare themselves for the practical assessments.

RPL/CREDIT TRANSFER

Students with prior learning and work experience can apply for RPL. Students who have completed corresponding units of competency and/or units contained within the packaging rules can apply for Credit Transfer. RPL evidence must include some of the following:

- Work experience
- Life experience
- Previous study
- Professional development programs
